ASHEBORO — Charles William "Bill" Husband, Sr., 93, of Asheboro, died Saturday, September 16, 2017 at The Randolph Hospice House in Asheboro.

A private graveside service will be held at Randolph Memorial Park, Asheboro, with military honors provided by the Randolph County Honor Guard.

A native of Rockingham Co., NC, Mr. Husband was born April 23, 1924, the son of the late Charles Howard and Lottie Julian Husband. He was retired from the NC Department of Corrections and had attended Oakwood Park Baptist Church. Mr. Husband had served in the US Marines during World War II and was a member of the Marine Corps League.

In addition to his parents, Mr. Husband was preceded in death by his wife, Lillian M. Husband, daughter, Susan Carol Husband, brother Donald Eugene Husband, and sister, Patsy Kathleen Husband.

While Sergeant Major Black and I don’t presume to speak for you or your family, we would like to offer our thoughts so you know where your senior leaders stand.

We both believe – without question – that your service was meaningful, powerful, and important. You answered the call to serve, proudly carrying the torch of so many generations of Marines before you. You put the good of others before yourself. You fought to defend your country, your family, your friends, and your neighbors. You fought to prevent terror from returning to our shores. You fought for the liberty of young Afghan girls, women, boys, and men who want the same individual freedoms we enjoy as Americans. You fought for the Marine to your left and the Marine to your right. You never let them down. You never, ever gave up. You lived with purpose, with intention. This is a time to come together and give further meaning to our motto, Semper Fidelis. Let us remain faithful to our fellow Marines, faithful to our Marine families, and faithful to the memories of all who have sacrificed.

We are intensely proud to serve alongside you as your Commandant and Sergeant Major.

September is Suicide Prevention Month

Reach out and stay connected to the Veteran in your life. Be There.

For a Veteran facing hard times, your support can provide hope when it's needed most - and you already have what it takes to show you care. Take a few minutes to check-in today.

Here are some ideas to help you get started with a call, text, or email:

- Talking on the phone with your Veteran loved ones can strengthen your connection. Calling just to catch up is important - especially during this unpredictable time.
- Not only does an open and honest conversation help people feel less alone, but it also can give you a window into their experiences.
- If you're worried about someone, you might need to have a more serious conversation.
- Remind them you are there for them, even if physically apart. It's easier to feel isolated these days - so reaching out is more important than ever.
- Validate their experience. Listen more than you speak - don't dominate the conversation. Even if you can't relate to what they are going through, you can tell them you understand that they went through something difficult and show them you respect their feelings about it.
- Let them decide how much information to share. Supportive and encouraging comments, rather than invasive personal questions, will create a space for open communication and avoid putting them on the defensive.

If you're concerned, it's okay to ask directly if they are thinking about suicide. Asking questions about thoughts of suicide does not increase a person's suicide risk, and the answers can help you determine the next steps to take.

Application For Financial Assistance from The Randolph County Veterans Council



Since its first event in September 2014, the Honoring Our Veterans Organization has raised approximately \$75,500 to assist needy Veterans and support Veterans causes in Randolph County. The Randolph Veterans Council, which administers the funds, has used the funds to provide financial assistance to approximately 150 local Veterans to date, covering a wide variety of needs such as medical bills, utility bill, rent, transportation to VA facilities and funeral expenses, among others.

The Honoring Our Veterans organization has also specifically authorized that a portion of the funds be used to support the Randolph County Honor Guard, which renders military honors for fallen Veterans, and to purchase flags to place on the graves of local Veterans in support of Operation Remembrance.

Randolph County Veterans who wish to apply for financial assistance from the Honoring Our Veterans fund may apply in person at the Randolph County Veterans Service Office, located at 158 Worth Street, Asheboro, NC 27203 Applicants must present a copy of their DD-214 discharge papers. Veterans who do not have their discharge papers may contact the Register of Deeds Office, which is co-located with the Veterans Service Office, to inquire about obtaining a copy of their DD-214.
